FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. Do we have to help all day?

No. You should consider at least a 2 hour session. When it comes to helpful cub scouts, use your best judgement.

2. Do we have to start at 9am?

No. Units and individuals can adjust their schedules to allow for maximum participation. Please let the event coordinator know when you plan on arriving, and how many are expected. This will be relayed to site coordinators.

3. Should scouts come in uniform?

No. As we will most likely getting dirty, wear clothes that you might wear while working in the garden. If your unit has a "class B" shirt, this might be the time to wear them. Makes for nice unit photographs.

4. Can scouts participate without adult supervision?

No scouts or youths under the age of 18 are allowed to help without an adult that is responsible for them.

5. What if our unit is not officially participating, can we help anyway?

Providing any individual scout or youth under the age of 18 attends with an adult [21 years and older] they are welcome. Just contact the event coordinator for appropriate sites.

6. We have friends, neighbors and family not in scouting, can they help?

Sure. Everyone is welcome and encouraged, providing there is proper adult supervision. Just contact your scouting unit or the event coordinator for appropriate details.

7. What if it rains or snows?

If it rains wear rain gear. If it snow, well wear snow gear. The event goes on rain or shine. Use your best judgement and try to contact your unit's coordinator or the site coordinator if you need to cancel.

8. Where will you be assigned:

We will post you to the closest available site unless you have a specific request. Park assignments will be by first come first serve and project needs. Work sites will be located in all 5 boroughs
